5 April 1967, the first phase of an important renovation of the Passenger Terminal (building P-3) was completed with the opening of a 20,000-sq. ft. annex. Modernization of the administrative and passenger check-in areas of the main terminal, first built between 1946 and 1947, began in June 1967.

On 8 March 1968, a 24-hour cafeteria opened in the terminal to serve hungry passengers. It cost \$400,000. Later, in September 1970, a branch of the base exchange opened across from the cafeteria. Despite these significant renovations, the increasing number of military personnel waiting for airlift to, or arriving from, Southeast Asia created long lines and a general overcrowding in the terminal. The passenger lounges overflowed and many people slept in the corridors. Another change dating from this period was the introduction of digital computers to Travis.
