Responsibilities include cargo processing, aircraft loading and unloading, joint inspection, mobility onload an unload locations, mobility load team supervision, engine running onloads and unloads, home station and deployed Air Terminal Operations Center, Airlift Control Element, Tactical Control Unit, Departure Airfield Control Group operations and command.

EMBLEM



On a triparted disc, four charges characterize the mission of the squadron. In the chief position, an ultramarine azure globe with argent longitude and latitude lines is placed on an or background. At dexter, an argent forklift is placed on an ultramarine azure background. At sinister, a gules stylized delta aircraft soars over a brittany blue background just above a vert puzzle piece. Two argent scrolls positioned above and below the disc. The scroll above is blank

and is reserved for the unit's designation. The scroll below is lettered in ultramarine azure and bears the unit's motto "capable proud prepared." **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and air force yellow are used in the design. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of air force operations. Yellow symbolizes the excellence of air force personnel. The red delta aircraft represents patriotism, courage and strength of the citizen airman. Brittany blue represents constancy devotion and truth. The emerald green puzzle piece professes adaptability, wisdom, life and fertile fields. The white forklift and lines of the globe represent wisdom, purity and truth. (Approved, 30 Nov 1988)
