EMBLEM



2110th COMMUNICATIONS SQUADRON

The emblem is symbolic of the unit and the Air Force colors, ultramarine blue and golden yellow, as well as silver and brittany blue are used in the design. The color brittany blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations, and yellow to the sun and excellence of personnel in assigned tasks. The ultramarine blue stylized aircraft design represents the flying training mission of the base and is the same stylized aircraft used in other emblems of the unit's support of the wing mission.
