### **OPERATIONS**

The 6924 SS put the Iron Horse system into operation at Da Nang AB and Monkey Mountain, South Vietnam. 1967

The 6924th RSM had been activated as the 84th Radio Squadron Mobile at Brooks AFB in 1953- Detachment A, 84th RSM preceded the 84th in relocating from Brooks to Shiroi Air Base in 1953. The 84th RSM arrived at Shiroi in early 1954 and began providing airborne intercept operators for reconnaissance missions aboard RB-29 44-62290 operating from Yokota Air Base. The 84th became the 6924th RSM in May 1955. Later in 1955, the 6924th RSM established Detachment 1, 6924th RSM at Yokota Air Base, Security Service's first airborne reconnaissance unit at Yokota.

The official date for the activation of the 6924th in Thailand was 1 April 1971. Sharing an existing intercept site (Army Security Agency's 7th Radio Research Field Station), Ramasun Station, and already having a USAFSS presence (Detachment 4, Pacific Security Region) on station, mitigated problems associated with the 6924th move from Vietnam.
