These flights were activated at Spangdahlem AB Germany and Aviano AB Italy on 23 January 1985 respectively. These units' jobs were to equip, store and maintain heavy-repair vehicles, and support equipment and move it to forward operating locations as required. The 7319th's equipment and personnel deployed to Saudi Arabia in 1990 in support of OPERATION DESERT SHIELD.

With the end of the Cold War, the two units now named the 729th RED HORSE Flight and 719th

RED HORSE Flight were inactivated on 30 November 1994 and the equipment sets were consolidated at Camp Darby, near Livorno Italy. The 616th RED HORSE Flight was activated at Camp Darby on 1 December 1994 and served until its inactivation on 1 August 1996.
