OPERATIONS Hq 7330th Maint & Supply Group provides command supervision over all assigned organizations,

and acts as a coordinating unit to insure that all operations relative to the transportation and supply of people and things, as well as the maintenance of material items are performed in a manner which results in high quality service at die luam possible cost when measured in terms of either money or manpower.

The Headquarters Squadron Section is divided into two units which provide staff supervision over all Group activities within their areas of responsibility as well as specialized services to subordinate organizations.

The Maintenance Control Unit is the "nerve center" for Furstenfeldbruck Air Base, responsible for planning and monitoring all pertaining to material maintenance and for quality inspection of work completed by maintenance organizations or activities of the M & S Group. The working force is made up entirely of "hard core" specialists who have long service in the maintenance field. Their storehouse of technical know-how has made maintenance of both the common and the complicated item of Air Force equipment a routine performance of duty and has contributed immeasurably to the effectiveness of the overall maintenance-engineering operation.

The Personnel and Administration Unit is charged with the responsibility for all activities relative to classification, training and assignment of personnel; maintenance of service records, personal affairs programs, records management, message center and mail room operation, and control of classified documents within the Group.

Manned by a small group of men with a well-rounded background in administrative procedures, their contribution to the overall mission is made through insuring that everything is done the Air Force way, by seeing that information pertaining to any phase of the complex maintenance and supply-operation reaches the proper person for action. Since nothing moves in the military service without a piece of paper to guide it along, the people assigned to this unit measure their effectiveness by how well the entire Group is performing its assigned mission.

They know the effective management consists of both efficient handling of administrative matters and effective use of our manpower resources, and are proud of the part they play in making the 7330th Maintenance and Supply Group an organization ready to meet the demands placed upon it in support of the MDAP pilot training program Fursty's contribution to the defense of the western world.
