Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The wolf symbolizes determination, a mighty force and the test of truth. The counter-change, or dark and light division of the wolf, emphasizes the day and night mission requirement of the Squadron. The eagle alludes to the fighting force of the United States Air Force. The globe represents the worldwide medical support provided by the professional personnel of the Squadron.
