

91st FIGHTER CONTROL SQUADRON

MISSION

Squadron mission was to man and operate both fixed and mobile radio stations for the control of fighter planes in the area allocated to the Boston Fighter Wing, both for the defense of that area and for the training of radio communications teams and fighter pilots, and in the radio control of fighters. Operated nine stations in eastern Massachusetts, as well as stations in neighboring New England states.
