EMBLEM

Azure, four concentric circles and crosshairs of a radar scope throughout Argent, surmounted by three deltas ascending to dexter chief Gules, fimbriated Sable, trailing three contrails to sinister base of the last, two lightning bolts bend sinister wise, one in sinister chief and one in dexter base Or, all within a diminished bordure of the last. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "AIR & CYBERSPACE INTELLIGENCE GROUP" in Blue letters. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Ultramarine blue and Air Force yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the

sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The stylized aircraft represent the Group's legacy of all-source analysis of foreign threat air systems. The concentric circles and crosshairs represent a radar scope that symbolizes the unit's tradition of electronic systems analysis. The lightning bolts represent cyberspace and the electromagnetic spectrum, a nod to the Group's newest mission areas. Finally, the sum of these parts speaks to the sophisticated engineering and full-spectrum Integrated Air Defense Systems analysis of which the Air and Cyberspace Intelligence Group is the sole provider for the Department of Defense.
