### **EMBLEM**



Per fess or and azure a fess nebuly abased argent below in chief an escutcheon azure charged with a plume of three ostrich feathers argent surmounted in base by a lamp or and bearing a key vert fimbriated sable, all within a diminished bordure or. **SIGNIFICANCE:** Against the field of gold and blue, the nebuly fess represents the flying mission of the Air Force. The key to knowledge denotes the Center's training mission and in the early Air Service color indicates the knowledge and skill required of technicians through the years to keep our air power the strongest in the world. The honorable augmentation, the escutcheon, charged with a plume and the lamp of knowledge, being the Arms of the Air Corps Technical School approved in 1929 and placed in stone on the facade of a doorway at Chanute AFB in 1940, commemorates the long history of technical training at Chanute and the Center's association with Chanute since their organization there in 1948.
