The 122nd Observation Squadron was organized in New Orleans in March 1941 and was federalized seven months later. Redesignated several times during World War II, the unit served in the MTO from November 1942 until October 1945. At the end of 1946, the squadron was reorganized as the 122nd BS and went on to fly A-26s for 10 years (including 21 months on active duty in the United States during the Korean War). Since the spring of 1957, the 122nd has flown jet interceptors and tactical fighters.

At the end of FY92, 1,656 officers and enlisted personnel manned 16 LA ANG units, including the 122nd FS which was flying F-15A/Bs from NAS New Orleans.
