Extended federal recognition in June 1923 and called to active duty in December 1940, Missouri's first flying unit served as the 110th TRS in New Guinea, the Philippines and Ie Shima from January 1944 until its inactivation in February 1946. Seven months later, the 110th was once again extended federal recognition in the Missouri Guard as a fighter squadron. In the immediate postwar period, the Missouri ANG was also to have organized a fighter squadron at Kansas City. Instead, the 180th was activated at St Joseph as one of the National Guard's first bombardment squadrons.

During the Korean War, the 110th FBS served on FAD in the United States while the 180th BS went to France. During the Berlin Crisis, the 180th TRS was not activated, and it was the turn of the 110th TFS to go to France. Neither squadron was placed on FAD during the Pueblo Crisis.

At the end of FY92, 2,825 officers and enlisted personnel manned 34 MO ANG units, including the 110th FS with F-15A/Bs at the Lambert-St Louis International Airport and the 180th AS at the Rosecrans Memorial Airport in St Joseph with C-130Hs.
