## **OPERATIONS**

During the fourth and fifth years of the Global War on Terrorism, the USAFE Air Mobility Operations Control Center (AMOCC) based at Ramstein AB, Germany. The AMOCC planned, scheduled, tasked, and executed airlift, air refueling, aeromedical evacuation, and operational support missions using fifty-two aircraft assigned to USAFE. These included 15 KC-135s with the 100th Air Refueling Wing based at Mildenhall AB, England, and 17 C-130Es, 13 C-21s, 2 C-20s, one C-37, and one T-43 assigned to the 86th Airlift Wing based at Ramstein AB. Approximately 100 missions were executed weekly during this time.
