Initiated on 10 January 1922 at Cambridge, MA. Redesignated as the 444th Pursuit Squadron on 25 January 1923. Relieved from assignment to the First Army 31 March 1924 and assigned to the General Headquarters Reserve. Demobilized on 1 October 1933.
