The first Air Service aircraft to use radios on a regular basis were the bombers of the 1 Air Brigade (Provisional) which carried voice sets to talk among planes in formation. In addition, each formation's control plane also carried a spark set of longer range to communicate with the station at Langley Field, and the naval base at Norfolk, Virginia, or U. S. naval ships along the line of flight.
