EMBLEM

On a light blue disc strewn with white stars within a narrow gold border a gold bend voided and inverted blue charged with two white broad arrows ascending. Below the emblem a gold scroll. The emblem is symbolic of the Squadron. The light and deep blues depict the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations, and allude to the unit's day and night maintenance function. The broad arrows symbolize airborne missiles; and their placement over the gold and blue bend denote the power and accuracy of the systems. The number of arrows indicate the unit's numerical designation. The stars refer to the SAC banner and placed on a sphere suggest the world-wide capabilities of the missile systems maintained by the Squadron. The emblem bears the Air Force colors golden yellow and ultramarine blue. (Approved, 8 Jun 1967)
