2 Field Investigations Region emblem: Celeste, a vol Or, surmounted by a globe palewise Azure, gridlined Argent, overall two swords in saltire points to chief Proper (Silver Gray) hafted Brown; all within a diminished border Yellow. Attached below the shield, a White scroll edged with a narrow Yellow border and inscribed "2D FIELD INVESTIGATIONS REGION" in Black letters. Blue and yellow are the Air Force colors. Blue alludes to the sky, the primary theater of Air Force operations. Yellow refers to the sun and the excellence required of Air Force personnel. The globe is representative of the global reach of the unit's mission. The wings imply the protection of the rights of free people. The crossed swords symbolize protection against all threats to air combat forces.
