OPERATIONS

1952 the Hq, 72d Strategic Reconnaissance Wing, Heavy, along with subordinate organizations paralleling those in the 55th Wing, were activated. Most of these units were manned only by one officer and one airman, but the 72d Reconnaissance Technical Squadron absorbed all personnel and equipment of the inactivated 55th Reconnaissance Technical Squadron and thus became fully operational at once, attached to the 55th Wing for control.

On April 15th, the 72d Reconnaissance Technical Squadron was inactivated. The 72d Strategic Reconnaissance Wing, which for several months had been performing bombardment operations in addition to reconnaissance work, shifted over entirely to bombardment operations. 1955
